SCHOOL PROFILE

- Islamiya English School is a private, non-profit educational institution. It is managed by a Board of Directors and recognized by the Ministry of Education & Youth, UAE under License No. 64/1. It is also recognized by the Cambridge (International Exam Board) for conducting IGCSE 'O' Level and International Advanced Level Courses.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONTEXT

- Its medium of instruction is English. Arabic, Islamiyat and UAE Social Studies are compulsory for all.
- The subjects in the School Curriculum are English Language, Arabic, Islamic Studies, Moral Education, Mathematics, Science (Physics, Chemistry, Biology), Social Studies, Global perspective, Commerce (Business Studies, Accountancy, and Economics), ICT, Arts and Physical Education.
- From Yr.-9, the students start preparing for the Cambridge International General Certificate of Secondary Education, Ordinary Level Examination Cambridge (International Exam Board) - (IGCSE, O/L). Students will appear for O/L Board Examination in Yr.-11. It is compulsory for the students to appear in all the subjects offered by the school. Students of Cambridge AS/A Levels will appear for exams in Yr. 12 & 13.
- The school endeavors to offer a wide range of co-curricular activities to ensure an all-round development of the pupils' personality.
- To discover and foster talent, training in various games, sports and activities in the fields of Art, Elocution, Recitation, Debates, Quiz Competitions, Educational Exhibitions, all clubs activities like Scouts club, Sports club, Chess club, Students club, Drama club, Eco-Science club, Volunteers club, IT club, Technological and Innovation club and Humanitarian Projects are provided. The students are encouraged to participate at school, inter-school & international level. Principles of honesty, trust, co-operation and self-reliance are inculcated through these activities.
- Administration at Islamiya English School LLC is indebted to its founder Chairman, the late Darwish Bin Karam Abdulla Al Qubaisi, who was keen to establish a school for certain population within the perimeters of Abu Dhabi that offers low tuition fees, and after his demise, his family took over the school to which made his legacy live up to today. Mrs. Khadija Darwish Al Qubaisi now chairs the School's Board of Directors, in addition to being one of the owners, the school is also managed by qualified academics that were appointed by the school Board, their Head being the School Principal, the administration also consists of two Vice-Principals, 3 Cycle Heads in addition to a Deputy Director, all are well qualified and were selected due to the expertise in that field.

HIGH PERFORMANCE LEARNING AT IES



High Performance Learning (HPL), as a set of thinking skills and a set of attitudes, has enabled us as a school to prepare our students for the world beyond school by focusing on the way that we learn, as well as what we learn. Thinking in this way has enabled us to become a better learning community: working together, collaborating, trying new things and, crucially, learning from our mistakes. From confidence, collaboration and risk-taking to agile-thinking, concern for society and perseverance - we ensure our students are prepared for study, work and life.

Neuroscience research has shown that there is not a fixed level of ability amongst young learners, and that the brain is more malleable than once thought. HPL provides a style of learning that removes barriers to achievement, by giving children an opportunity to develop intelligence in their own time. This reflects our long-held belief that there is 'room at the top' for more students than traditional approaches suggest.

As a school, we have always strived to develop both intellectual and social confidence, encouraging students to show concern for others and to prepare for life's challenges. SUPERVISED STUDY CLASSES:

In order to help the slow learners & some newly admitted students to progress at the pace of the whole class, special attention is given to them. Special classes/Remedial classes/Focus group classes at no extra fee are held for such students.

House System:

To inculcate a sense of loyalty, team spirit and healthy competition, students are divided into four houses, viz. Falcon house, Oryx house, Ghaf house, Tribulus house. Each House is headed by a House Master, House Mistress, House Captain and Prefects. Every student is allotted a particular House. Several activities are conducted on an inter-House basis.

Pastoral Care/Wellbeing at IES:

The school considers the protection, safety and well-being of every pupil in its care a major priority & responsibility. Issues including health, social & moral education, behavior management and emotional support are taken care of. RULES FOR ADMISSION

Registration/Admission: Registration is done prior to Admission.

FS-2 (KG-I)	3 Yrs. 8 Months
Yr. - 1 (KG-II)	4 Yrs. 8 Months

Registration for admission to the FS-2 Class begins in the month of March/ April.

Registration for admission does not ensure admission to a particular class. The school reserves the right to reject applications without assigning any reason.

Withdrawal:

1. One month's written notice of intention of withdrawal is to be submitted to the school authorities.
2. "Clearance Form" duly completed is to be submitted at the school office after the letter of intent. One month's fee in lieu of notice will be charged if written notice is not given.
3. Transfer Certificate will be issued only after all dues have been cleared.



Expulsion:

The students will be expelled from the school for the following:

1. For Disciplinary Reasons:
 - a) If he/she commits deeds against honour, honesty and any religious value.
 - b) If he/she consistently violates the school rules.
 - c) If he/she deliberately damages the school property.
 - d) If he/she is indisciplined & doesn't mend ways.
2. For Non Disciplinary Reasons:
 - a) If the student remains ABSENT for NO REASON or for UNACCEPTABLE reason for 20 consecutive or 25 non-consecutive days.
3. Students expelled for disciplinary reasons will not be re-registered at all.

SCHOOL FEE:

1. School Fee is payable in three equal instalments by-
 - a) 31st August
 - b) 10th of December &
 - c) 10th of April
2. Students will not be permitted to attend the School if their fee is not paid after two written reminders by the Class Teacher and warning letter by the Principal.

TRANSPORT:

School has outsourced the transport facility to a competent service provider.

- Islamiya English School Abu Dhabi LLC has outsourced the school transport service to (Fairway Transport Company) to ensure that the journey between home and school is convenient and safe.
- Each bus is equipped with seat belts, GPS tracking, CCTV cameras, DOT Approved bus driver and a bus monitor who ensures that children are always safe as the bus moves through the busy streets of Abu Dhabi.
- Our bus service covers most areas within the Abu Dhabi city.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

All students are expected to attend the school in the proper uniform. Wearing of the prescribed school uniform is compulsory for all pupils not only during normal school hours but also on all occasions, such as functions, picnics and PTMs'. Failure to comply with the school uniform regulations may result in suspension from classes.



Pre-Primary Section (KG1 & KG2)

Boys: White Shirt, Olive green trousers, Blue T- Shirt and Grey trousers (Sports uniform), Grey Winter Jacket. Black shoes & White/Black socks as prescribed.

Girls: White Shirt, Pink Pinafore, Pink T-Shirt and dark Grey trousers (Sports uniform), Grey Winter Jacket. Black shoes & White/ Black socks as prescribed.

Grades 1- 12.

Boys: Grey Trousers, white Shirt, Blue with grey pattern T-Shirt and Grey Trousers (Sports uniform), Grey Winter Jacket.

Black shoes & White/ Black socks as prescribed.

Girls: White Shirt, Maroon pinafore, Maroon with grey pattern T-Shirt and grey Trousers (Sports uniform), Grey Winter Jacket.

Black shoes & White/ Black socks as prescribed.

All the students will use the prescribed school Jacket in winter. Students are not allowed to wear rings, chains, lockets, long earrings, etc.

Parent-Teacher Meeting/Parental engagement

We strive to work in full partnership with parents, sharing information/progress and achievements throughout the week via our Seesaw App/MS Teams and via meetings/phone calls. We have three formal PTMs across the school year, however we have an open-door policy and encourage parents to meet SLT/ Teachers frequently to discuss progress and next steps in learning
Entry allowed only to those students who are in school uniform.

SYSTEM OF EVALUATION: (From Yr.-5 to Yr.-10)

The academic year is divided into three terms. Regular assessment is made through written, oral and class assignments /weekly tests / monthly tests / monthly tests, project work, records of which are maintained by the teachers concerned besides this, there are term exams at the end of each term. Promotion at the end of the academic year is granted on the basis of continuous evaluation. The weightage for each is as indicated below.

A student's parents are fully responsible for ensuring the highest levels of attendance possible and not less than 97%.

Punctuality

- Systems in place to support the arrival of students to school.
- Additionally, the staff on hand to support will challenge and record late arrivals through a supportive and educational approach – for example “By missing the first 5-minutes of school this has a disruptive impact on the teaching & learning taking place, as well as your child’s start to the school day”.
- Persistent lateness arriving to school will be escalated to Class Teacher/ SLT.

Punctuality should be strictly observed. Those who come late without valid reasons may not be permitted to enter the classroom. A record of late-comers will be maintained and appropriate action will be taken. Depending upon the frequency of default, a student after reprimand & information to the parent can be suspended/ rusticated from the school with the approval of the Ministry. Parents are requested to co-operate in this regard.

Regular attendance is necessary. **For all Classes 95% attendance is obligatory otherwise they will not be eligible to sit in the qualifying exam.** Absence is not permitted unless leave is applied for on valid grounds and granted by the Principal/H.M.



Parents are expected to inform the school (Leave/Absence Record) while making a request for sanction of leave.

Separate applications should be sent for leave exceeding 3 days.

The names of those who remain absent for one month without permission will be struck off the rolls. Re-admission will be made on payment of re-admission fee, depending on availability of seats. Pupils must attend School from the re-opening day, after the vacation. If absence is due to sickness, a Medical Certificate must be submitted with the leave application.

Pupils suffering from contagious diseases will not be allowed to attend the school.

If a student happens to miss a test/assignment, for any reason, the same shall not be re-arranged for him/her.

A student who fails twice in the same grade will discontinue his/her studies at the school.

No pupil is permitted to leave the school premised during the school hours without obtaining permission from the Principal/H.M.

Speaking English in the class and the school premises is compulsory for all pupils.

Pupils must refrain from running, playing and shouting inside the school building.

The School expects the co-operation of parents to ensure that their children.

- a) Come to school regularly on time and are dressed neatly and properly.
- b) Bring to school their books and notebooks properly maintained and as per time-table.
- c) Prepare for their lessons and do their homework regularly.
- d) Pick & drop their wards on time.
- e) Offer no gifts to teachers and other staff members.

They are also expected to co-operate with the school authorities by taking active part in the activities of the school. In particular, they should bear in mind that in the interest of their wards, they have entrusted the Principal/H.M./Sectional in-Charge with the authority to admonish and correct the children at their discretion.

Disciplinary action may be taken against children for:

- a) Not wearing the proper uniform.
- b) Not coming to school on time.
- c) Not doing the given home work/class work
- d) Repeatedly forgetting to bring the necessary text books, note books etc, to the class.
- e) Damaging school property
- f) Constantly indulging in misconduct
- g) Fighting with class/school-mates.
- h) Misbehavior with teachers
- i) Cheating
- j) Stealing
- k) Bunking the class/school
- l) Using bad language
- m) Any Immoral Act.



n) Use of Whiteners

Parents are advised not to let their children bring expensive articles to school. They should not give them excessive pocket money because the School will not take any responsibility for the belongings of the students.

**Students are not allowed to bring mobile phones and other objectionable items to the school.
Confiscated items will not be returned at all.**

While the Management is extremely careful in taking all safety measures and precautions to avoid and prevent any possible accidents, some mishaps may take place. It must be understood that parents/guardians entrust their children/wards to the school staff at their own risk and the Management shall at no time be held responsible for any such incidents, inside or outside the school premises and during camps, picnics and excursions.

Islamiya English School - Parent Code of Conduct
